A computer and a web browser	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> OS Windows 7 preferred Most screencast technology is not compatible with tablets or iPads
Java Runtime & Plugin software	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Free software which runs lots of applications and interactive programs, including games, chat and web-based content Will run in the desktop view in Windows 8, but can be problematic (personal experience ☹)
Media Player	To play the screencast – e.g. QuickTime, Flash or Media Player
Getting Started	Instructions
Connect to Screencast-O-Matic	http://www.screencast-o-matic.com/
Set up an account	Click the 'login' link to register
Watch a demonstration	Click the 'Welcome' link to go to the Home page
Troubleshoot	Click the 'Help' link from any page
Making a recording	Notes
Click the 'Start Recording' button	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Accept prompts to install or update Java Log in to your account before recording
Check the microphone	 <p>Make sure the correct microphone is detected</p>
Check the sound level	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use the Auto Adjust Volume setting if possible (it will depend on the microphone in use) Click the record button to test the volume
Adjust the frame	Readjust the frame size so that you capture everything you need in the recording.
Prepare material	<p>Get everything you will need for the recording ready</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Open applicable documents and connect to relevant websites Adjust the size so they fit into your pre-prepared frame size
Record	 <p>Click the red button to start recording (3 second countdown)</p>  <p>Tip: The red volume monitor will move as you speak. Keep an eye on this to make sure the sound is recording properly. Also, monitor the time.</p>
Pause	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You can pause the recording by clicking the Pause button You can also Restart
Finish	 <p>Tip: Keep monitoring the recording time</p>

Saving a recording	Notes
Name the recording	Type into the Recording Name box (top left hand corner)
Publish	 <p>Choose Screencast-O-Matic to add to your Screencast library, or another format.</p>
Publishing options	<p>Experiment with the various options for publishing by watching the series of tutorials on the SOM website.</p> <p>TIP: Under SOM Options, deselect 'Searchable' so the screencast can't be located on the internet.</p>
Upload and send	<p>Click the 'Upload to SOM' button</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The screencast is first encoded, then uploaded ▪ While uploading you can continue with other computer work ▪ When complete the screencast is allocated a http:// link address ▪ Close out of this upload window to return to the main SOM site ▪ Click 'Uploads' to see the saved screencast ▪ Click the chain symbol to retrieve the link to send and share
