Click the 'Start Recording' button	Accept prompts to install or update JavaLog in to your account before recording	
Check the microphone	Make sure the correct microphone is detected	
Check the sound level	 Use the Auto Adjust Volume setting if possible (it will depend on the microphone in use) Click the record button to test the volume 	
Adjust the frame	Readjust the frame size so that you capture everything you need in the recording.	
Prepare material	Get everything you will need for the recording ready Open applicable documents and connect to relevant websites Adjust the size so they fit into your pre-prepared frame size
