Keiko Yasukawa is a lecturer in Adult Education at the University of Technology, Sydney (UTS). Her academic career began at Macquarie University where she taught mathematics and computing and was involved in setting up a drop-in Numeracy & Learning Centre for university students who needed to improve their numeracy skills. She now teaches and coordinates the Graduate Certificate in Adult Numeracy Teaching and the Graduate Diploma in Adult Literacy and Numeracy Teaching at the UTS. Her research interests are in critical numeracy and literacy, and examining the tensions between policy, pedagogy and practice. She is an editor of *Literacy and Numeracy Studies: An international journal for the education and training of adults*. She is also the current Vice-President of the Australian Council for Adult Literacy, and the President of the NSW Adult Literacy and Numeracy Council.
